

Bridge Climbing in Algeria

This is a list of all 4 bridges from the suspension bridge inventory for the country Algeria. Wherever you see a Bridgemeister ID number click it to isolate the bridge on its own page.

It was opened to traffic in April 1912 and until 1929 was the highest bridge in the world at 175 m (574 ft). The bridge was designed by French engineer Ferdinand Arnodin and links the Casbah to Sidi M'Cid hill.
