



# Uganda Bridge

On 17 October 2018, this new 525-meter-long Source of the Nile Bridge was personally commissioned by his Excellency the President of Uganda. This enormous cable-stayed bridge is one of the most ...

The bridge is located at Jinja city (the second capital of Uganda after Kampala) across the Victoria Nile, between the source of the Nile to the south and Nalubaale Power Station (old bridge) to the north.

The new Nile bridge which was financed by the Japanese government, is a cable stayed bridge at 500 meters upstream of Nalubaale Dam.

The New Nile Bridge's uniqueness is in it being the longest single-plane cable configuration with a waterproof deck on the entire African Continent.

The New Jinja Bridge (also known as Second Nile Bridge) is built across Nile River connecting the town of Njeru to Jinja, which is part of International Trunk Road (east-west direction) of Kampala (Capital) ...

Connecting Jinja town and Kampala city, the iconic Nile Bridge has played a significant role to the transportation industry, hence boosting Uganda's economy at the largest percentage.

The 525 metres (1,722 ft) long bridge will carry a four-lane dual highway with pedestrian walks. It's estimated to have cost about \$125m to construct with 80% of the financing done by the ...
